

From the Amvon/Pulpit of Father John Adamcio:

COURSE CORRECTION.....

A fascinating factoid: When you get on an airplane, the aircraft can be "off course" more than 90% of the time! Yet, it manages to arrive at its destination safely, and on time. Due to weather conditions and other factors, the pilot has to make necessary course corrections from time to time, getting back "on course."

We are coming close to the beginning of the Great Fast. The Holy Orthodox Church in her wisdom gives us four preparatory Sundays to get us ready for the Fast itself. Incidentally, there are several Sundays that lead up these preparatory Sundays, allowing us to "change gears" in order for us to get the most out of our Lenten preparation for Holy Pascha. Among these pre-preparatory Sundays we hear about the Blind Beggar (who miraculously receives his sight by our Lord), and the Canaanite Woman (whose humble, yet insistent pleading prompted Jesus to heal her daughter).

Today, we hear about the encounter between our Lord and Zacchaeus. In this incident, our Lord brings "salvation to his house," and Zacchaeus changes his attitude and life.

These pre-preparatory Sundays bring us to the Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee, which is the beginning of the Lenten Triodion, a selection of special verses and hymns taking us through the Great Fast to the celebration of the Feast of Feasts, the Holy Day of Holy Days: Pascha.

In this space over the next few weeks, we will examine the ways we can take advantage of making personal "course corrections" so that we can truly celebrate the wonderful and most joyous day of Pascha. We will examine the practice of prayer, fasting, receiving Confession (especially during days of penance and repentance), as well as preparing to receive Holy Communion. With the wonderful Scripture readings the Holy Church gives us, as well as the marvelous opportunities for corporate prayer (especially the Divine Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts) we will be shown the way to Pascha.

Bit by bit, we will be able to see where we have "gone off course" and the best way to get back on course. Thus, we will be able to travel that road which the Holy Prophet Isaiah prophesies: A highway shall be there, and a road, and it shall be called the Highway of Holiness (Isaiah 35:8).

This is an exciting time to be on this highway, and one to which we can look forward traveling together.
