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#### HOLY ASSUMPTION CHURCH LIBRARY

From Roberta Royhab--Beginning today and continuing each month I will write about books that are available in Holy Assumption Church's Library. There are books about our faith and spiritual life; saints and saintly people; "the forgotten desert mothers"; the "wisdom of the desert fathers"; the mystery of repentance; the ministry of women in the Church; Holy Angels; grief; Lent...

Today's article features three biographies of saints. Reading about a saint is a fascinating experience, bringing to us the life of an extraordinary spiritual person and the times in which that person lived. They are:

<u>Grand Duchess Elizabeth of Russia, New Martyr of the Communist Yoke</u> by Lubov Millar. A strikingly beautiful granddaughter of Queen Victoria and the older sister of Empress Alexandra of Russia, Grand Duchess Elizabeth (1864-1918), who grew up in Germany, married Grand Duke Serge Alexandrovich, governor of Moscow. Her life in Imperial Russia began in a whirlwind of dazzling social engagements, a world soon to be eclipsed by war, the assassination of her husband, and the gathering storm of revolution.

Consciously adopting the Orthodox Faith early in her marriage, she thoroughly dedicated herself to fulfilling the Great Commandment of Love—nursing the sick, rescuing children from Moscow's slums, establishing the Martha-Mary Convent of Mercy in Moscow, and during World War One nursing soldiers in hospitals and on the battle front. She was respected and admired throughout Russia and people came to her for spiritual direction. Executed in a mineshaft by Soviet soldiers on July 5, 1918, Saint Elizabeth the New Martyr was canonized in 1992.

<u>ST. INNOCENT Apostle to America</u> by Paul D Garrett. (Also available to borrow is his 48-page book, <u>Indication of the Way into the Kingdom of Heaven.</u>) This biography of Saint Innocent of Alaska, 1797-1879, traces the course of his life: his boyhood in Siberia; his call to mission in America; his labors first as priest and then as bishop in Alaska and in Asia; his last years as Metropolitan of Moscow.

At the same time, the book reveals the many facets of his warm personality—his abiding interest in the natural and social sciences, affection for his children, unfailing sense of humor. Known as "Evangelizer of the Aleuts and Apostle to America," Staint Innocent was canonized in 1977.

Blessed John the Wonderworker by Fr. Seraphim Rose and Abbot Herman. Saint John Maximovitch of Shanghai and San Francisco (1896-1966) is believed by Orthodox Christians throughout the world to be the holiest man of the twentieth century.

Saint John served the Church as bishop first of Shanghai in the Far East, then of Western Europe, and finally of Western America and San Francisco. He was a God-inspired theologian and a "Fool-for-Christ," a zealous missionary hierarch and a feeder of the poor, a severe ascetic and a loving father to orphans. He brought his flock of 5,000 from communist China to the free world—lobbying Washington, D.C. to amending the law to allow these refugees to enter the United States.

He was given power from God to heal, and would mystically hear and answer people's thoughts before they would express them. He continues to visit and pray for those who call upon him, as is attested by miracles and healing.

The book includes numerous source-materials on Saint John's life, a pictorial biography, and 100 personal testimonies of his sanctity. He was canonized in 1994.

### Apostle James, the Brother of the Lord $\!\!\!/$ Commemorated on October 23

Holy Apostle James, the Brother of God (Adelphotheos) was the son of Righteous Joseph the Betrothed of the Most Holy Theotokos (December 26). From his early years James was a Nazarene, a man especially dedicated to God. The Nazarenes vowed to preserve their virginity, to abstain from wine, to refrain from eating meat, and not to cut their hair. The vow of the Nazarenes symbolized a life of holiness and purity, commanded formerly by the Lord for all Israel. When the Savior began to teach the nation about the Kingdom of God, Saint James believed in Christ and became His apostle. He was chosen as the first Bishop of Jerusalem.

Saint James presided over the Council of Jerusalem and his word was decisive (Acts 15). In his thirty years as bishop, Saint James converted many of the Jews to Christianity. Annoyed by this, the Pharisees and the Scribes plotted together to kill Saint James. They led the saint up on the pinnacle of the Jerusalem Temple and asked what he thought of Jesus. The holy Apostle began to bear witness that Christ is the Messiah, which was not the response the Pharisees were expecting. Greatly angered, the Jewish teachers threw him off the roof. The saint did not die immediately, but gathering his final strength, he prayed to the Lord for his enemies while they were stoning him. Saint James' martyrdom occurred about 63 A.D. *Con't Pg 5*

The holy Apostle James composed a Divine Liturgy, which formed the basis of the Liturgies of Saints Basil the Great and John Chrysostom. The Church has preserved an Epistle of Saint James, one of the books of the New Testament.

In 1853, Patriarch Hierotheus of Alexandria sent to Moscow a portion of the relics of Saint James. The Church distinguishes between the holy Apostle James the Brother of God, and Saint James the son of Zebedee (April 30) and Saint James the son of Alphaeus (October 9).

#### Milwaukee Archpriest Celebrates 50th Anniversary of Ordination

Archpriest Thomas Mueller, the former Rector of Saints Cyril and Methodius Orthodox Church in Milwaukee, WI, was recently honored at an event held by close family and friends commemorating his 50th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood.

Ordained on November 19, 1972, in Boston, Massachusetts at the Albanian Orthodox Cathedral by Bishop Stephen, Fr. Thomas served at St. Elia Albanian Orthodox Church in Jamestown, NY from 1972-1975. He then served in the Diocese of the Midwest in Royalton, IL; Lublin, WI; Mentor, OH; and finally in Milwaukee, WI since 1984. During that time, he served as Dean of the Chicago Deanery from 1987-2018, and as Chancellor of the Diocese from 1988 to 1993 and again in 1995. Fr. Thomas worked with diocesan missions and parish development in particular.

During his time as Rector at Saints Cyril and Methodius Church, he successfully fought to keep the parish in the city, welcomed several waves immigrants who could easily access an urban parish, and connected the Church to many charitable and faith-based urban advocacy organizations. Fr. Thomas currently serves two chapel outreach ministries of Saints Cyril and Methodius in Waukesha and Plymouth, WI. He still serves as president of the Pan-Orthodox Milwaukee Orthodox Christian Clergy Association.

At a small local celebration on October 2nd, many people recalled all this work and their own personal connections with Fr. Thomas. For many years Father has been known as a rousing preacher of the Gospel and a firm and supportive presence in the Deanery and Diocese, and a repository of the history of the local church.

#### **Luke 16:19-31 (Gospel)**

There was a certain rich man who was clothed in purple and fine linen and fared sumptuously every day. But there was a certain beggar named Lazarus, full of sores, who was laid at his gate, desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table. Moreover the dogs came and licked his sores. So it was that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels to Abraham's bosom. The rich man also died and was buried. And being in torments in Hades, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. Then he cried and said, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus that he may dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame.' But Abraham said, 'Son, remember that in your lifetime you received your good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things; but now he is comforted and you are tormented. And besides all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed, so that those who want to pass from here to you cannot, nor can those from there pass to us.' Then he said, 'I beg you therefore, father, that you would send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, that he may testify to them, lest they also come to this place of torment.' Abraham said to him, 'They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them.' And he said, 'No, father Abraham; but if one goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' But he said to him, 'If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded though one rise from the dead.'"
