**Heartbeat Bill Passes With 60 Votes!
Ohio House sends strong pro-life message
Right to Life Action Coalition of Ohio applauds
vote to pass Heartbeat Bill.**



Yesterday (Friday before Thanksgiving) the Ohio House of Representatives voted with a veto-proof 60-35 majority to adopt the Heartbeat Bill (House Bill 258), the legislation to protect unborn children by making aborting a child with a beating heart illegal.

"We are grateful for the leadership of sponsors Rep. Christina Hagan of Alliance and Rep. Ron Hood of Ashville working this bill through the process" commented Ed Sitter, President of the Right to Life Action Coalition of Ohio. "We are also thankful for the 60 members who realize that all life is worthy of protection and supported the bill."

After an extended floor debate punctuated by a recess for a caucus and a number of amendments offered by Democrat members which were all tabled, the measure was approved 58-35. However, two members who did not vote at the call, Democrat Rep. Glenn Holmes of Trumbull County and Republican Rep. Marilyn Slaby of Stark County, cast votes in favor later during the session making the final tally 60-35.

"It is an exciting day for the cause of life" noted Molly Smith, Vice President of RTLACO. "Now that the House has shown the strength to confront the expected veto of Governor Kasich, we look forward to the Senate quickly adopting this bill and making it Ohio's law."

Cleveland Right to Life thanks all members who took action and called State Representatives yesterday to ensure this lifesaving result.

Matushka Susan Blomquist

Matushka Susan Jane Blomquist, wife of the late Priest Robert James Blomquist, peacefully fell asleep in the Lord on November 7, 2018.

Born in 1943 to Edward and Elizabeth Jane La Fortune, she and her husband were married in 1966, after which the future Father James enrolled in Saint Vladimir's Orthodox Theological Seminary, Yonkers, NY. After his ordination in 1971, the couple served parishes in Lublin, WI; Buffalo, NY; Detroit, MI; London, ON, Canada; and Winnipeg, MB, Canada

Matushka Susan was employed in a variety of fields, specifically in the insurance industry. She volunteered her time at church and at many other agencies, including Doors Open Winnipeg. She manifested the generosity of Christ towards humanity. She was most dedicated—even to the day before her repose—to seniors and shut-ins by visiting them and driving them to church and doctor appointments or to visit family in nursing homes. She provided flowers and food for parish feasts (especially those dedicated to the Mother of God) and for those who were hungry, all the while giving what little energy or funds she had.

Matushka Susan was predeceased by her husband in 2002. She is survived by their three children, Stacy [Robbie], Christopher [Marie] and Michael [Shannon], and four grandchildren.

Archpriest Joseph Martin

Archpriest Joseph Martin, retired Dean of [Holy Resurrection Cathedral](#), Wilkes-Barre, PA, fell asleep in the Lord on Friday, November 9, 2018 at the Penn Presbyterian Medical Center after a brief illness.

Born in Frackville, PA on Holy Pascha, April 5, 1942, the son of the late Joseph and Anna Martin, he was a 1963 graduate of [Saint Tikhon's Orthodox Theological Seminary](#), South Canaan, PA. He married the former Gloria Matechak on October 16, 1965. He was ordained to the priesthood by His Grace, Bishop [later Archbishop] Kiprian on November 7, 1965, after which he served Holy Trinity Church, McAdoo, PA for 29 1/2 years while also serving parishes in Shenandoah, Saint Clair, Minersville, and Mount Carmel, PA. In 1995, he was assigned Dean of Holy Resurrection Cathedral, from which he retired in 2014. The following year, he celebrated the 50th Anniversary of his ordination.

In addition to his wife, Matushka Gloria, Father Joseph is survived by his daughters Cathryn [Dr. John] Haber, Trescow, PA; Juliana [Jeffrey] Good, Hellertown, PA; Marina Martin and her fiancé James Turnbach, Conyngham, PA; Deborah [Judd] Good, Hellertown, PA; eight grandchildren: Elena, Alex, Andrew, Anna, Aaron, Kyra, Stephen and Sara; brothers Melvin, David, and Paul; and many nieces, nephews, and great nieces and great nephews. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his brother Frederick.

In addition to his parish duties, Father Joseph served in various of capacities in the Diocese of Philadelphia and

Eastern Pennsylvania, including Dean of the Frackville Deanery. He was the longest continuously serving Board Member of Saint Tikhon's Orthodox Theological Seminary and its [Century Association](#) and was active in the [Fellowship of Orthodox Christians in America](#) [FOCA]. At the time of his repose, he served as Chief of Chaplains at the Wilkes-Barre Veterans Medical Center. His community activities included serving as past Chaplain of the McAdoo Fire Company and the McAdoo Lions Club. He also was a founding member and Past President of the Wilkes-Barre Lions Club and Chaplain and Past District Governor of Lions District 14W.

Deacon Paul Hilko

PORT SAINT LUCIE, FL [OCA]: Deacon Paul M. Hilko, 79, fell asleep in the Lord unexpectedly while on vacation with his beloved wife Lorraine and friends on November 12, 2018.

Deacon Paul was born and raised in Passaic, NJ, the son of the late Prof. Michael P. Hilko, well known long-time choir director at Saint John the Baptist Church, Passaic, NJ. Deacon Paul's life was one of service. Growing up in the Carpatho-Russian tradition, he learned both its spiritual and cultural traditions and mastered its sacred music in writing and singing. A humble man of God-given natural talent, he excelled in the art of singing Prostopinije (Plainchant), a traditional form of liturgical chant unique to the Carpathian regions. He served as choir director for some 30 years in Carpatho-Russian parishes in Passaic and Rahway, NJ and at Saints Peter and Paul Russian Orthodox Cathedral, Perth Amboy, NJ.

After serving in the Army, he then attended Lincoln Tech Institute in Scotch Plains, NJ, at which he later taught. In 1964, he married the former Lorraine Servas, who would give birth to two beautiful daughters, Eugenia "Gina" and Deborah. Upon his retirement from teaching, Deacon Paul and Lorraine relocated to Port Saint Lucie, FL in 2003 and began attending Saint James the Apostle Church. After five years serving in the choir at the parish, he sensed the call of God to the diaconate. In 2008, he was ordained by His Eminence, the late Archbishop Dmitri at Saint Seraphim Cathedral, Dallas TX. He went on to serve 10 years as deacon at Saint James Church, where he was known as a friendly, faithful, fun loving person. He will be best remembered for his commitment to Jesus Christ, the Orthodox Church and his wife and family. He was a humble, Spirit-filled man of God who served Christ and His Church with all his heart.

In addition to his wife, Deacon Paul is survived by their daughters Eugenia "Gina," Deborah and her husband Tim Constantine, and grandchildren Morgan, Ronnie, Jamie and Timothy.

Today (Nov. 13) —with deep love, respect and heartfelt thanksgiving—we mark the sixth Anniversary of the [election of His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon](#) at the [17th All-American Council](#) of the Orthodox Church in America, which was held at Holy Trinity Church, Parma, OH on November 13, 2012.

On behalf of the Holy Synod of Bishops and the clergy, monastics and faithful of the Orthodox Church in America, we assure Metropolitan Tikhon of our ongoing love and prayers today and in the many years to come. May our Lord continue to grant him peace, prosperity, safety, honor, health and length of days “rightly dividing” the word of God’s truth as he marks this milestone in his life and in the life of the Church!

Axios! Eis polla eti despota! May God grant you many, many years, Your Beatitude!

Metropolitan Tikhon was born in Boston, MA on July 15, 1966, the son of Francois and Elizabeth Mollard. After brief periods residing in Connecticut, France, and Missouri, he and his family settled in Reading, PA, where he graduated from Wyomissing High School in 1984. In 1988, he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in French and Sociology from Franklin and Marshall College, Lancaster, PA, after which he moved to Chicago.

In 1989, he was received into the Orthodox Church from the Episcopalian tradition and, in the fall of the same year, he began studies at Saint Tikhon’s Seminary. The following year he entered [Saint Tikhon’s Monastery](#) as a novice.

After receiving his Master of Divinity degree from [Saint Tikhon’s Orthodox Theological Seminary](#) in 1993, he was appointed instructor in Old Testament at the school. He subsequently served as Senior Lecturer in Old Testament and taught Master level courses in the Prophets and the Psalms and Wisdom Literature. He also served as an instructor in the seminary’s Extension Studies program, offering courses in the lives of the Old Testament saints, the liturgical use of the Old Testament, and the Old Testament in patristic literature. He collaborated with then-Igumen Alexander [Golitzin] in the publication of *The Living Witness of the Holy Mountain*, published by Saint Tikhon’s Seminary Press.

In 1995 he was tonsured to the Lesser Schema and given the name Tikhon, in honor of Saint Tikhon, Enlightener of North America and Patriarch of Moscow. Later that year, he was ordained to the Holy Diaconate and Holy Priesthood at Saint Tikhon’s Monastery. In 1998, he was elevated to the rank of Igumen, and in 2000 to the rank of Archimandrite. In December 2002, he was appointed Deputy Abbot of Saint

Tikhon’s Monastery.

After his consecration to the episcopacy, he served as Auxiliary to the Metropolitan. He was nominated to fill the vacant See of Philadelphia and Eastern Pennsylvania at a special diocesan assembly on May 25, 2005. Two days later, he was elected to that ministry by the members of the Holy Synod of Bishops. He was installed as ruling hierarch of the Diocese at Saint Stephen Cathedral on October 29, 2005. He served as Bishop and later Archbishop of the Diocese until his election as Primate of the Orthodox Church in America on November 13, 2012.

Luke 13:10-17 (*Gospel*)

Now He was teaching in one of the synagogues on the Sabbath. And behold, there was a woman who had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bent over and could in no way raise herself up. But when Jesus saw her, He called her to Him and said to her, “Woman, you are loosed from your infirmity.” And He laid His hands on her, and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God. But the ruler of the synagogue answered with indignation, because Jesus had healed on the Sabbath; and he said to the crowd, “There are six days on which men ought to work; therefore come and be healed on them, and not on the Sabbath day.” The Lord then answered him and said, “Hypocrite! Does not each one of you on the Sabbath loose his ox or donkey from the stall, and lead it away to water it? So ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has bound – think of it – for eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath?” And when He said these things, all His adversaries were put to shame; and all the multitude rejoiced for all the glorious things that were done by Him.

Ephesians 5:9-19 (*Epistle*)

(for the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness, righteousness, and truth), finding out what is acceptable to the Lord. And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather expose them. For it is shameful even to speak of those things which are done by them in secret. But all things that are exposed are made manifest by the light, for whatever makes manifest is light. Therefore He says: “Awake, you who sleep, arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light.” See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is. And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord,
