Announcing the Monthly Matching Gift Challenge

This December, the Diocese of the Midwest will be kicking off a Monthly Matching Gift Challenge to support Orthodox ministries in Midwest America. There is much good being done in the name of Jesus Christ by Orthodox Christians in our own “backyards.” In an effort to support this good work, the Mother Maria of Paris Charitable Ministry of the Diocese of the Midwest will be offering five matching gifts of \$1,000 to five Orthodox ministries in the upcoming five months.

In each month of the Matching Gift Challenge, the Mother Maria of Paris Charitable Ministry will call on individuals from the diocese’s clergy and laity to give sacrificial offerings of \$1,000 to match the ministry’s donation.

A generous gift of \$10,000 by an anonymous donor in October has made the Monthly Matching Gift Challenge possible. The remaining \$5,000 will be distributed to other Orthodox ministries or as seed money for larger fundraising projects.

Ideas for Sunday School Students

The Mother Maria of Paris Charitable Ministry especially wants to encourage our youth to learn stewardship in a hands-on way by fundraising within their parishes and communities. Some ideas that we’ve gathered for Sunday School students or youth groups are:

- **Penny Challenge:** Have the Sunday School kids compete against the adults in collecting the greatest number of coins. One coin jar can go on the candle desk and the kids can have the other jar. The group that collects the most coins wins!
- **Quilt Square:** Give the students squares of cotton fabric to draw an event from the life of the Church, such as Christ’s Nativity or Baptism, using permanent markers or fabric paint. They can have their own square or can partner up. Then an adult will sew them all together to make a quilt of the students’ creation, which can be raffled off.

- **Mosaic Icon:** Have the students cut out colored squares from magazines, and then arrange them as a group into a mosaic icon. This highly unique icon can also be raffled.

Monthly Matching Gift Challenge Kickoff: Children's Creative Arts Area for Orthodox Detroit Outreach

The Mother Maria Charitable Ministry of the Diocese of the Midwest is kicking off a Monthly Matching Gift Challenge to support Orthodox ministries in Midwest America, in which they will be offering a matching gift of \$1,000 to five Orthodox ministries in the upcoming five months.

In each Monthly Matching Gift Challenge, the Mother Maria Ministry will call on individuals from the diocese's clergy and laity to give sacrificial offerings of \$1,000 to match the Mother Maria Ministry's donation.

December: Orthodox Detroit Outreach

In this first Monthly Matching Gift Challenge, the Mother Maria Ministry is offering a matching gift of \$1,000 to Orthodox Detroit Outreach to help fund a children's creative arts area for local children of families who come to Orthodox Outreach Detroit (hosted by Sts. Peter and Paul Orthodox Cathedral) for food, clothing, and encouragement.

A children's creative arts area will provide children with opportunities to play and learn in a safe space just for them on the Sundays and Wednesdays that they come for meals. V. Rev. Paul Albert, the pastor of Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral and Spiritual Director of Orthodox Outreach Detroit, said that the two items needed to begin the formation of a quality children's creative arts area will cost up to about \$2,500 (see pictures below).

The Mother Maria Ministry is challenging and encouraging individuals in the diocese to partner with Orthodox Detroit Outreach in their work for the children of Southwest Detroit by matching this \$1,000, or as they are able to give. This could be done on a parish level, an individual level, or through a Church School fundraising activity (see [here](#) for ideas). Checks can be made out to Orthodox Detroit Outreach and sent to 3810 Gilbert St., Detroit, MI 48210. Please note the check as being a "matching gift with the DOM."

These two items are a necessary first step for Orthodox Detroit Outreach to develop a quality children's arts and crafts area in Saints Peter and Paul

Cathedral Church School wing, where some of their outreach meals and ministries will be held in 2020.

These items are hand made in the USA of Rock Maple, ensuring many years of productive use. Eventually, Orthodox Detroit Outreach envisions a space similar to what is depicted below.



About Orthodox Detroit Outreach

For the past four decades Southwest Detroit has been in steady economic decline. Many homes in the immediate vicinity of Saints Peter and Paul Orthodox Cathedral lie derelict, and many of the church's neighbors suffer from homelessness, poverty, and despair.

In 2012, Orthodox Christians from many Detroit area parishes founded Orthodox Detroit Outreach (ODO) in an effort to provide for their neighbors' basic needs, presenting an opportunity for the Orthodox Church to serve Christ in our neighbors. In 2013, ODO Ministries partnered with Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral in the heart of Southwest Detroit.

Over the past seven years, Orthodox Detroit Outreach has coordinated volunteerism for the Greater Detroit area to serve the poor by regularly serving meals through the week, distributing clothing, hygiene items, and diapers, and hosting annual holiday dinners for the community. Local neighbors find compassion in the faces of volunteers, spiritual nourishment in the Divine Services of the Church, and hope in the Word of God. Approximately 1,500 volunteers per year provide thousands of hours of service and tens of thousands of meals to those in need.

1st CORINTHIANS – CHAPTER 13, Rewritten for the Christmas Season

- If I decorate my house perfectly with lovely plaid bows, strands of twinkling lights, and shiny glass balls, but do not show love to my family, I'm just another decorator.
- If I slave away in the kitchen, baking dozens of Christmas cookies, preparing gourmet meals, and arranging a beautifully adorned table at mealtime, but do not show love to my family, I'm just another cook.
- If I work at the soup kitchen, carol in the nursing home, and give all that I have to charity, but do not show love to my family, it profits me nothing.
- If I trim the spruce with shimmering angels and crocheted snowflakes, attend a myriad of holiday parties, and sing in the choir's cantata but do not focus on Christ, I have missed the point.
- Love stops the cooking to hug the child. Love sets aside the decorating to kiss the husband.
- Love doesn't envy another home that has coordinated Christmas china and table linens.
- Love doesn't yell at the kids to get out of your way.
- Love doesn't give only to those who are able to give in return, but rejoices in giving to those who cannot.
- Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, and endures all things.
- Love never fails. Video games will break; pearl necklaces will be lost; golf clubs will rust. But giving the gift of love will endure.

What Do We Mean by Unity in Diversity?

"...eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." (Ephesians 4:3)

In the body it is the living Spirit that holds all members together, even when they are far apart. So it is here. The purpose for which the Spirit was given was to bring into unity all who remain separated by different ethnic and cultural divisions: young and old, rich and poor, women and men. (John Chrysostom on Ephesians 4:3)

I share this verse from last Sunday's epistle reading and the brief quote from St. John Chrysostom because he answers the question I posed in my title. What is so wonderful is that in the Church we can be who we are, and yet still be united as one soul, one mind, and one spirit.

What I love about our Orthodox Church in America is that we are slowly becoming a diverse church that is becoming less "Slavic" in its demographics. In my visits to churches in the diocese, I encounter a greater number of people from different ethnic backgrounds. I was at the Cathedral in Minneapolis on Sunday and met at least five Greeks who came to venerate the cross, whom I believe are members there. We are emerging as a great tasting salad of different ingredients that is changing the image of who we are. This is not just in the OCA, but it is happening elsewhere as well. These are baby steps that are beginning to manifest the kind of unity that John Chrysostom describes.

We still order our church life in most "jurisdictions" according to nationalistic identities. We are "separate but equal" when it comes to the way church life is organized here in America. The more that local churches (on a Pan Orthodox level) work together in the building up of our unity around our faith, eventually we bishops will get the message and act.

But what does this have to do with family life? Parents: encourage your children as they meet people to be good listeners and to learn about the backgrounds of the people they come to meet. Encourage your children to participate in a summer camp that is multi-Orthodox in make up. It is amazing to see the bonds that get forged in these camps. With the diversity of these cultural expressions there is a wonderful unity that is emerging.

Luke 14:16-24 (Gospel)

Then He said to him, "A certain man gave a great supper and invited many, and sent his servant at supper time to say to those who were invited, 'Come, for all things are now ready.' But they all with one accord began to make excuses. The first said to him, 'I have bought a piece of ground, and I must go and see it. I ask you to have me excused.' And another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to test them. I ask you to have me excused.'

Still another said, 'I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.' So that servant came and reported these things to his master. Then the master of the house, being angry, said to his servant, 'Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in here the poor and the maimed and the lame and the blind.' And the servant said, 'Master, it is done as you commanded, and still there is room.'

Then the master said to the servant, 'Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled. 'For I say to you that none of those men who were invited shall taste my supper.'"

Sunday of the Forefathers Commemorated on [December 15](#)

The Sunday that falls between December 11-17 is known as the Sunday of the Holy Forefathers. These are the ancestors of Christ according to the flesh, who lived before the Law and under the Law, especially the Patriarch Abraham, to whom God said, "In thy seed shall all of the nations of the earth be blessed" (Gen. 12:3, 22:18).

Righteous Benjamin Commemorated on [December 15](#)

The youngest son of Jacob, he was called Benoni and then Benjamin (Genesis 35:16-18). Before his death Jacob blessed him in a seemingly back-handed way, saying that "Benjamin is a ravenous wolf, devouring his prey in the morning, and dividing the spoil in the evening" (Genesis 49:27). Commentators say this is not a reference to Benjamin himself, but to the warlike nature of the tribe of Benjamin.
