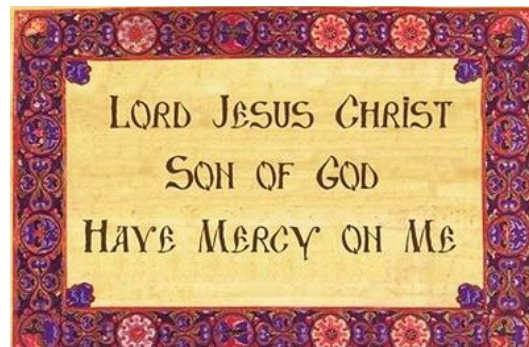

New Diocesan Chancellor Announced

During the Diocesan Council meetings which were held on December 1st and 2nd, His Eminence Archbishop Paul announced that effective February 1st 2021, Archpriest Paul Jannakos will be appointed Chancellor of the Diocese of the Midwest. Longtime Chancellor, Archpriest John Zdinak, will be retiring and assisting with the transition.

The Chancellor of the Diocese is the first priest of the diocese and serves as main administrator assisting the Archbishop's office. More information will be forthcoming as this transition develops.

\$4,500 Given to Better Serve Those in Need

The charitable arm of the Diocese of the Midwest, [Mother Maria Charitable Ministry \(MMCM\)](#), completed a recent campaign to help an active food ministry in Columbus, OH. As [previously reported](#), the MMCM was asking for an additional \$1,500 to help [St. Gregory of Nyssa Orthodox Church](#) with their weekly ministry of feeding the poor.

“We sent the parish a check for \$4,500 towards their kitchen remodeling project for much needed upgrades to more effectively help those they serve,” said Priest Jonathan Lincoln, head of the MMCM. “Our ministry provided \$3,000 while we asked for \$1,500 from donors to complete this project. This was covered by one donation from [Holy Trinity Cathedral](#).”

These funds went directly to replacing vitally-needed equipment, such as a dishwasher, large refrigerator, deep freezer, stove top/oven, etc. Archpriest Stephen Frase expressed his gratitude to His Eminence Archbishop Paul, Fr. Jonathan, and all of those who made this effort possible. A brief video of Fr. Stephen explaining their work can be seen below.

Metropolitan Tikhon presides over funeral services for Archbishop David

On Tuesday, December 1, 2020, [His Beatitude Metropolitan Tikhon](#) served the funeral services for the newly-departed [Archbishop David](#) at [Holy Trinity Church](#), Wilkes-Barre, PA.

At 3:30 PM, [His Beatitude served the memorial service \(Panikhida\)](#) following the arrival of Archbishop David's body. Serving with His Beatitude were His Grace [Bishop Thomas](#) of Charleston, Oakland, and the Mid-Atlantic Diocese of the Antiochian Archdiocese, as well as His Eminence [Archbishop Michael](#) of New York and the Diocese of New York and New Jersey.

Following viewing hours, the [Order for the Burial of a Hierarchy](#) was held at 6:00 PM. Prior to the service, Archpriest Alexander Rentel, Chancellor of the Orthodox Church in America, read letters of condolences from several local Orthodox hierarchs who had known Archbishop David and were mourning his passing. His Grace Bishop Thomas then offered his own condolences, and shared some remembrances about his fellow worker and personal friend Archbishop David.

His Beatitude Metropolitan Tikhon, His Grace Bishop Thomas, His Eminence Archbishop Michael, and His Grace [Bishop Alexis](#), Bishop of Bethesda and Locum Tenens of the Diocese of Sitka and Alaska, then served the funeral service, along with the priests Archpriest Alexander Rentel; Archpriest Raymond Martin Browne, Chancellor of the Diocese of Eastern Pennsylvania; Archpriest Innocent Dresdow, Chancellor of the Diocese of Sitka and Alaska; Archpriest Timothy Hojnicky, who ministered to Archbishop David in his final days; and the deacons Protodeacon Gregory Moser, Deacon Peter Kamilos, and Deacon John Thetford. The choir was a quintet led by Benedict Sheehan of [Saint Tikhon's Orthodox Theological Seminary](#).

His Beatitude offered his thanks to His Eminence [Archbishop Mark](#), Priest Innocent Neal, and Holy Trinity Church, Wilkes-Barre, PA, for warmly accommodating the funeral services.

His Beatitude then [offered the following eulogy](#):

This evening to offer hymns of departure to our brother and concelebrant in the Holy *Con't Next Page*

Exposing the Works of Darkness in Family Life / Reflections from the Archbishop

Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. For it is a shame even to speak of the things that they do in secret; but when anything is exposed by the light it becomes visible, for anything that becomes visible is light. (Ephesians 5:11-13)

This verse from Ephesians was part of the epistle reading for last Sunday December 6th, the feast day of St. Nicholas. How did St. Nicholas expose the works of darkness in his ministry? As we raise our children how do we help them to cope with evil in this world and bear witness to the world's initial goodness? Read the life of St. Nicholas as found on the OCA webpage and I think one can find answers to these questions.

Too often we deal with evil by engaging others in a debate about it, and we argue over who is right and who is wrong. When we deal with matters that way, it usually doesn't get anywhere. It reminds me of the following words from our Lord:

Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when all the time there is a plank in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye. (Matthew 7:3-5)

The life of St. Nicholas gives wonderful examples of how he exposed darkness by doing good rather than debating matters. Here are a few examples of how St. Nicholas exposed evil through goodness and love,

- *He saved a father from selling his three daughters off to become prostitutes by throwing three bags of coins in secret through the window of their home.*
- *He interceded with the governor in Myra on behalf of three men unjustly condemned to death. The sentences were overturned, and the governor repented of his behavior.*
- *He saved three military officers from execution who were falsely found guilty. Nicholas appeared in a dream to the emperor*

- *Constantine to have him overturn the verdict and free them.*
- *Through the prayers of Nicholas, he rescued Myra from famine. He appeared to a merchant, leaving him three gold coins to buy and deliver grain to Myra.*
- *There are more.*

At the anaphora prayer of St. Basil, we call upon our Lord to: "Preserve the good in goodness, and to make the evil be good by His goodness." Let us encourage one another to follow after the example of St. Nicholas by becoming the Light of Goodness or, more so, the Light of Christ. Let us kill what is evil in us and in this world by the kindness of our love for one another.

Eulogy Con't

Mysteries, the newly-fallen asleep Archbishop David, who now lies surrounded by his brother bishops, his fellow clergy, and his beloved family and friends. Truly, the Lord himself, who glorified his life upon the earth, now makes glorious his departure from this life and his entrance among the saints, to be numbered with all those who from all the ages have been well-pleasing in God's sight (prayer after the second Gospel).

He is surrounded by his fellow-laborers in the vineyard, the bishops of the Orthodox Church in America, as well as his brother and friend, His Grace, Bishop Thomas, of Oakland, Charleston, and the Mid-Atlantic, who brings with him the condolences His Eminence, Metropolitan Joseph and the entire Antiochian Orthodox Christian Archdiocese.

Archbishop David is also surrounded by his brother priests and deacons who shared their ministry with him, both as a long-serving deacon in the Diocese of Western Pennsylvania, and as a faithful priest in the Diocese of Eastern Pennsylvania, where he served as District Dean and was very active in the promotion of the clergy brotherhood and offering his services on the diocesan level.

At heart, Archbishop David was a teacher, always finding ways to offer guidance to his flock but always acknowledging the importance of learning in his own life. Whether pursuing his own higher education, teaching at Saint Tikhon's Seminary, or leading his flock as a bishop in Alaska, he truly made his own the words of the psalmist: *Teach me, O Lord the way of Thy statutes; and I will keep it to the end. Give me understanding, that I may keep Thy law and observe it with my whole heart. Lead me in the path of Thy commandments, for I delight in it* (118:33-35).

Regardless of the context of his pastoral ministry he always maintained and gave forth a heartfelt delight in the life-giving commandments and the glory of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. He was consistent in this attitude whether serving as a deacon, as a priest, or as bishop. With the same spirit, he remained a faithful husband to his wife, Matushka Katherine, during their life together and a devoted father to his children, Nicholas, Michael, Seth, and Kyra, their spouses and families, and reserving an especial love for, and devotion to, his grandchildren, whom he would make a point of visiting as frequently as he could without neglecting his pastoral responsibilities in the distant lands of Alaska.

To the sorrow of the loss of their mother thirteen years ago is now added the sorrow of the departure of their father and grandfather. And yet, Archbishop David would most certainly want them all to heed the words of the prayers from this evening's service, offered for them and for all of us who share in their mourning: *O Lord of Hosts, Who art the consolation of the afflicted, the comfort of those who mourn, and the support of all those who are fainthearted: Comfort, through Thy lovingkindness, those who are distressed with weeping for him who has fallen asleep, and heal every pain that weighs on their hearts* (Prayer after the third Gospel).

Archbishop David was always quick to offer that same consolation and comfort to others. He was especially attentive to this paternal love and oversight for the clergy, monastics, and faithful of the Diocese of Alaska. Although his episcopal ministry there was shorter than any of us would have hoped for, there is no denying the very real and concrete

impact that he had, not only in bringing stability to the diocese after a period of difficulties, but in further attending to the spiritual and physical health of the clergy, the faithful, and the patrimony and history of the Orthodox Church in America which is so clearly manifest in the oldest diocese of our Church.

As he prepared for the end of his earthly sojourn, Archbishop David made clear his intention to be buried at the Monastery of Saint Tikhon of Zadonsk, the monastery of his repentance, where lies his beloved wife, Karen. For various reasons related to covid precautions, it was decided to hold the funeral services here, in one of the parishes of the Diocese of Eastern Pennsylvania.

On behalf of the Holy Synod of Bishops of the Orthodox Church in America, especially those concelebrating this evening, His Eminence Archbishop Michael, and His Grace Bishop Alexis, together with all the bishops of the Assembly, represented this evening by His Grace Bishop Thomas, I offer my condolences to the family and friends of the newly-departed Archbishop David and lift up the prayer that we heard this evening: *We beseech Thee, receive the soul of Thy servant, and grant him rest in the bosom of Abraham and Isaac and Jacob, and give him the crown of Thy righteousness, the portion of the saved, in the glory of Thine elect. And for those things, which in this world he accomplished for Thy Name's sake, may he receive a rich reward in the mansions of the saints; through the grace and bounties and love toward mankind of Thine Only-begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ* (Prayer after the first Gospel).

Colossians 3:4-11 (Epistle)

When Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory. Therefore put to death your members which are on the earth: fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. Because of these things the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience, in which you yourselves once walked when you lived in them. But now you yourselves are to put off all these: anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy language out of your mouth. Do not lie to one another, since you have put off the old man with his deeds, and have put on the new man who is renewed in knowledge according to the image of Him who created him, where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcised nor uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave nor free, but Christ is all and in all.
